Of 700-1000 Creek Warriors who attacked Ft Mims, it is thought that a large number may have died, up to 200 or more. Only the following names are known:

Coolajer (Light Maker), 'Dog Warrior', Creek Indian, Redstick Leader from an Alabama town (s)

Cyrus (Moniac), Negro Slave who joined the Redsticks (s)

Efa Tastanagi (Efv Tustunuke), 'Dog Warrior', Creek Indian from Atasi (s)

Far-off Warrior, Hopoie Tastanagi (Hopvye Tustunuke), Creek Indian, leader from Taskigi, Killed

Otee Emathla Jumper (Ohta Emahlv), Creek Indian (s)

Nahomahteeathle Hopoie (Enhomahtvhorre Hopvye) 'Foremost man in danger in time of battle', Creek Indian from Jim Boy's town (s)

Old Interpreter (James Walsh*), Creek-Irish (s)

Russell____*, son of Hoithlewaule', Creek-English (s)

Sonata (Jim Boy), Creek Indian (s)

Seekaboo* (Shawnee-Creek-English), Prophet, relative of Tecumseh (s)

William Steadham*, Creek-Swedish, Redstick Creek Warrior, son of John Steadham (s)

Paddy Walsh*, Redstick Creek Prophet, from Tawasa, wounded but survived

William Weatherford* (Hopnicafutsahia, war name), Creek-English, Redstick Creek Leader, Wind Clan, Tensaw Resident, later called 'Red Eagle' (s)

Chief of Wewocau, Creek Indian, Led first warriors into Fort Mims (s)
